Information about eVisas (label-less visas)

Applications for New Zealand student, visitor and work visas can be made through Immigration ONLINE. From November 2016, all successful Immigration ONLINE applicants will be granted eVisas (label-less visas). Some online applicants will still need to send in their passports for authentication.

What is an eVisa?

New Zealand visas are recorded electronically by Immigration New Zealand. Where an eVisa is granted, the visa holder will not have a visa label in their passport but will receive electronic notification of their visa approval via their Immigration ONLINE account. This notification contains visa details, including travel and other visa conditions. Visa holders are advised to print and carry this notification when they travel.

Some online applicants still need to send in their passports for authentication; however even when the applicant has to send their passport, a visa label will not usually be issued.

How will airlines, education providers and employers be able to check visa status?

Airlines flying to New Zealand are subject to obligations under the Immigration Act 2009 and associated Regulations. Online systems (New Zealand Advance Passenger Processing and TIETAC NZ) are available for airlines to confirm that a person can travel to New Zealand, in accordance with those obligations.

Employers and Education Providers in New Zealand can use the online system **VisaView** to check whether a person has the right visa to work or study for them https://www.immigration.govt.nz/about-us/our-online-systems/visaview

Other third parties, and visa holders themselves, can verify their visa using the Visa Verification Service https://www.immigration.govt.nz/about-us/our-online-systems/visa-verification-service

How will foreign governments be able to check visa status?

eVisa holders have a number of options available to them if they need to provide details of their New Zealand visa when travelling overseas.

- Show a copy of their visa approval notification
- Log in to their Immigration Online Account or the Visa Verification Service to show a copy of their visa details (including on a mobile electronic device)
- Advise the relevant agency their visa details so that they can be verified using the Visa Verification Service
